Department of Transportation Nears Halfway Mark on the Operation Orange Cone Street Resurfacing To Double with Added Resources from Dixon Administration

The Department of Transportation proudly announces that it has completed 42 lane miles of road resurfacing and reconstruction this season with another 38 miles already under construction.

"We are well on our way to meeting Mayor Dixon's goal of doubling the number of lane miles resurfaced this construction season," said Al Foxx, Director of the Baltimore City Department of Transportation.

Mayor Sheila Dixon announced Operation Orange Cone on April 24, 2007 as a major city wide campaign effort engineered by the Department of Transportation. The campaign focuses on resurfacing and reconstruction of City streets as well as repairing sidewalks and alleys.
