Gossett, Contract Purchasers, 5201 Franklinton Road – Class “B” Beer, Wine & Liquor License - **Review of transfer application pending for more than 180 days** under provisions of **Article 2B, Section 10-503(d)(4)** “A transfer of any license shall be completed not more than 180 days after the Board approves the transfer” (Re: Transfer approved on March 22, 2001 and most recently reviewed by Board on January 11, 2007 when an extension of 360 days was granted); **Article 2B, Section 10-504(d)(2)(i)** “180 days after the holder of any license issued under the provisions of this article has closed the business or ceased active alcoholic beverages business operations of the business for which the license is held, the license shall expire unless: (i) An application for approval of a transfer to another location or an application for assignment to another person pursuant to § 10-503(d) of this subtitle has been approved or is then pending” and **Article 2B, Section 10-504(d)(6)** “If an application or request to the Board described in paragraph (2) or (3) of this subsection is withdrawn, there shall be no tolling of the period for automatic expiration of the license and it shall be deemed as if no such application or request was filed.” **DECISION:**

(iii) Making of any material false statement in any application for a license or permit...” from renewal 2002 to date (Re: Name and signature of Jason Roberson on liquor license renewal applications in 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2007 and adult entertainment license renewal applications in June 2002, 2006 and 2007; individual reports that he was not aware that his name was still on license and he did not sign renewal applications); **Violation of Article 2B §16-501** “If any signed statement, report, affidavit, or oath, required under any of the provisions of this article, shall contain any false statement, the offender shall be deemed guilty of perjury, and upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to the penalties provided by law for that crime” from renewal 2002 to date (Re: Name and signature of Jason Roberson on liquor license renewal applications in 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2007 and adult entertainment license renewal applications in June 2002, 2006 and 2007; individual reports that he was not aware that his name was still on license and that he did not sign renewal applications)
